- * During the Revolutionary War, he was a captain, colonel, and general in different militia/armies.
- * He built and received approval for many campaign strategies that had important impacts on the war.
- * He was wounded in multiple battles.
- * He resigned his commission many times but came back to lead troops when called.
- * A monument erected in recognition to his deeds reads, in part, “the most brilliant soldier of the Continental army... winning for his countrymen the decisive battle of the American Revolution.”
- * He received little to no credit at the time due to bad feelings between him and his commander.
- * In July 1780, he commanded the fort at West Point.
