Center for Development of Security Excellence (CDSE) It is vital to national security to have a uniform program to govern the classification of information and to provide guidance on how to classify, store, transport, or destroy it. The program must not only determine the guidance, but also oversee the application of that guidance.

The purpose of the Department of Defense Information Security Program is to promote the proper and effective way to designate, mark, protect, and disseminate classified and controlled unclassified information (CUI) requiring protection in the interest of national security. It also facilitates the declassification of information no longer requiring such protection.

STEPP Tip: How Do I Locate a Certificate?

The Security Training, Education, and Professionalization Portal (STEPP) is CDSE's learning management system that provides a gateway to access our education and training courses.

Need to locate a course completion certificate?

If you completed a course **after October 1**, **2018**, navigate to the Course Page and select the "Certificate of Completion" button. From your STEPP Transcript view, hover your cursor over your name at the top right of any STEPP page and select the "My Transcript" option. Scroll down the list and select the name of the course, and a certificate for the course will be generated in your browser.

For courses completed **prior to October 1**, **2018**, hover your cursor over your name at the top right of any STEPP page and select the "My Transcript" option. Below "My Transcript" is "My Training Record." Select the name of the course, and a certificate for the course will be generated in your browser.



Get Easy Access to Training with the Hub

Need to complete your mandatory training? The Security Awareness Hub provides open access to courses that do not require a STEPP account, registration, or sign-in information. Courses include mandatory annual training for DoD, U.S. Government, and defense industry personnel who do not need transcripts to satisfy training requirements for their specialty area. A certificate is awarded for successfully completing the course but must be printed or saved upon course completion. Certificates are not available once the course is closed. The Hub can be easily accessed from the <u>www.cdse.edu</u> homepage under "Take Training."
