Professionalization

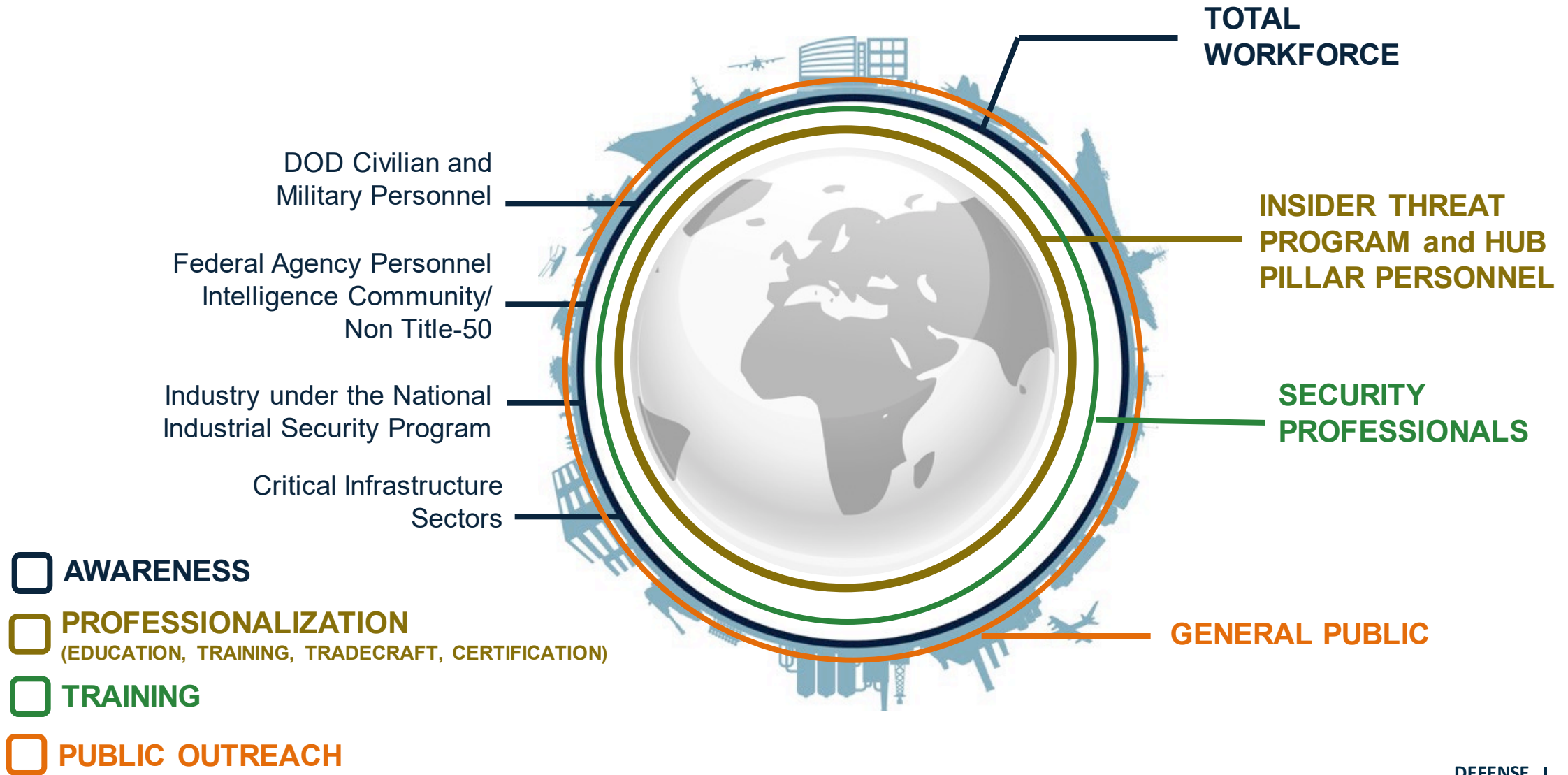
- Supporting the development of tradecraft for insider threat analysts and operations personnel.
