## Presenter Notes

- Before the presentation, watch *The Email* video and fill out the bottom portion of this Job Aid. Some starting ideas are listed, but add more ideas that may be pertinent to your program.
- Prepare the audience for the video. Find a great transition to let them know they are getting ready to watch a CDSE training video.
- Relate the content of this video to the audience (examples below):
  - We've been pretty good in regards to security incidents lately, so I thought I would show you this CDSE video to see just how good we are at spotting some common security mistakes.
  - We've had a few examples of security incidents over the past year, so I wanted to show this quick CDSE video as an opportunity for us to see and identify a few common errors throughout the security world.
- Let the audience know that you'll be soliciting feedback after the video:
  - After the video, we'll go over a few of the items that we noticed in the video.
- Show the video
  - For maximum retention, it is recommended to show the video twice to give everyone the opportunity to see some of the more subtle mistakes made in the video.
  - Refer to the lists that you created below to help foster discussion.
  - A useful way in which to encourage audience participation would be to have "rewards" that you can give participants for their contribution.

### Errors Found

- Customer sent classified email via unclassified network
- Employee forwarded a suspected classified email via unclassified network
- Employee pulled classification guide from a file cabinet (depends on local policies)
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### Prevention

- Ensure that employees know the procedures for data spills
- Employees should understand open storage policies, if allowed, and how they are applied
- Employees should report any security incidents to the CPSO/GSSO/PSO immediately
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
